Leader's Notes

- Remember to encourage your group members to go slow and focus on the process, not the end result. Use additional verses from the lesson for extra Quiet Time resources as needed.
- PRAY for your group as they begin experiencing Jesus as the One who comes to bind up the brokenhearted and set the captives free. Stay true to teaching the Word and let the Holy Spirit do the hard work!
- Highlight one or two questions from the lesson to be discussed in group time, allowing each person to share an answer. For quick reference, write the page numbers of the questions you chose to discuss below.

Navigating Your Group Time

- Spend 15-20 minutes in worship.
- As the time of worship comes to a close, the leader should begin the WAR method of prayer.
- Write a quick summary of Lesson 1 in the space below. Share this with the group to begin the lesson after the time of prayer is finished.

- Ask everyone to share their "Main Take-Away" from the end of the lesson.
- Ask each person to share a Quiet Time.
- As a group, go over the two different *Heart Illustrations* on pages 11 and 14.
- Have each person share her findings from the "Words Exercise" on pages 16-17.
- Reiterate the importance of looking up the meanings of keywords on pages 17-18.

Healing with Jesus

ayla recalled how she loved being a big sister. Her mother had told her stories of how at three years old, she was so proud of her new role. But even more than that, she loved her daddy! Layla was floored by the fact that she was once called a "daddy's girl"! At age four, her parents divorced and her dad rarely came around to see her. Somewhere along the way, Layla believed the lie that she wasn't very special, and may even be unlovable. She learned to harden her heart and not trust others easily. She learned from her step-dad that father figures just provided necessities, like food and clothing, but never cherished or delighted in her.

There were no daddy-daughter dates, long walks, or conversations. No one built her swing sets or threw her tea parties with feather boas. No man had ever invested in her character or taught her that she didn't have to settle for someone to love her.

As Layla and I talked, I suspected Layla had projected this lack of expectation onto her Heavenly Father as well. She confirmed it when I asked her if she felt Jesus loved her. Layla jokingly replied, "Well, yes the Bible and the nursery rhyme tell me so!" In essence, she believed God loved her because He had to—not because He delighted in her or because she was His cherished creation.

As an adult, Layla stuffed her failures inside, trying to hide them from God and her loved ones so that she didn't disappoint anyone. Layla believed she needed to be good and pleasing for God to love and accept her as His own. She had bought the lie that if she disappointed God, He would leave her.

This had affected how she lived as a wife, mother, friend, coworker, and most importantly, how she thought about God. Until she allowed God to come in and heal the lies that had taken root in her heart, she wasn't able to believe or experience the fullness of God's love for her.

Layla didn't want to pour into her marriage and children from a heart full of yuckiness. She wanted pure, clean truth that only comes from a loving, Heavenly Father. As Layla grew in her relationship with God, she started to trust Him with her deepest feelings. She began to tell Him of the more shameful things she had

tried to hide in the past. The more Layla poured out the infection in her heart to God, the closer she felt to Him.

She learned through her time alone with God that He is always waiting and willing to listen to her for as long as she wants to talk. She came to understand that He never has more important places to go or more meaningful business to handle. She realized He is always present, and when her heart is breaking, He comes even closer. She began to see there was nothing too ugly in her heart that He wouldn't love her through, because He knew her intentions even when she was confused and felt worthless.

The more Layla poured out the infection in her heart to God, the closer she felt to Him. Layla realized she was a cherished and chosen daughter of the One True King, and she began to walk in freedom for the first time in her life. Until now, she had always had a relationship with God that she could live with, but now, she had one she could not live without!

YOU ARE IN THE HEART OF GOD

Layla would not have been able to break free from this cycle of brokenness without intimacy with Jesus. This required her to allow Him to heal her by cleaning out the layers of wounds and lies that had built up in her heart. Jesus loves you and He wants you to know it! What better way could He prove it than by binding up your heart wounds and setting you free? And, as if that wasn't enough, He traded His very life for yours in the most traumatic way. The God of all creation loves you more than anything else He spoke into existence, and His actions prove it!

Being a cherished daughter of God is not determined by your past, what kind of home you come from, your ethnicity, weight, level of education, or what you have or have not accomplished in life. When you accept Jesus as your Lord and Savior, you are adopted into the heart of God—no exceptions. Even before you were saved, the God of all creation was pursuing you, wanting to spend ever-after with you.

The importance of binding up the brokenhearted and setting the captives free is so you may be firmly planted in the Truth of your Creator, and be found with no condemnation in you, because your confidence is in God (1 John 3:21). When the enemy strikes you with lies about your Heavenly Father and about your identity, you answer with HIS truth and remain steadfast in your identity in Him.

The Word of God states in 1 John 3:20 that the contents of your hearts can condemn you, but thankfully God knows the truth. "Letting the Healer Heal" is about allowing God to search out the pain in your heart by removing the lies. This can only be done through the Word and the Holy Spirit.

The purpose is to prepare the soil of your heart for good seeds waiting to be planted. If the soil in our garden is full of rocks and life-choking weeds, then the wounds soak up the nutrients, causing fruit-bearing seeds to shrivel and die before they are able to bloom. By allowing Jesus into these hurt places, He is able to clean the soil of our hearts from the hurt that keeps us from being fruitful, making our hearts a receptive and fertile field for His planting and harvest.

Then He told them many things in parables, saying:

"A farmer went out to sow his seed. As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky places, where it did not have much soil.

It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow.

But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root. Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants. Still other seed fell on good soil, where it produced a crop—a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown.

—Matthew 13:3-8 NIV

HOW DID WE GET SO FAR AWAY FROM WHO WE WERE DESIGNED TO BE?

Before claiming our rightful place in the heart of God, we embellished ourselves with the world's deceptive ideas of value, freedom, and love. We believed these lies filled in our gaps, making us whole, valuable, and worthy of affection, yet all the while we were being led further away from who God created us to be. Before we are wives, mothers, sisters, friends, or disciple-makers, we are daughters of the Most High!

Now let's just talk straight for a minute. It's a common thought and practice among believers to avoid putting focus on the enemy, and I agree! While we should never take our eyes off of Jesus to see what Satan is doing, 2 Corinthians 2:11 tells us to be aware of the enemy's schemes. The enemy, also known as "the father of lies" (John 8:44), revels in our pain and despair. He comes for one purpose, and that is to "steal, kill, and destroy" anything precious to God (see John 10:10).

Our "heart" is where our beliefs, attitudes, feelings, emotions, and memories are stored; it's our personality, where we store the things we value. Having unaddressed wounds, sin, painful memories, etc., in our hearts leaves the door wide open for the enemy to exploit our beliefs, attitudes, feelings, emotions, and memories. He starts by whispering lies that our young, inexperienced minds cannot navigate around.

Eventually, these lies become woven into the strands of our spiritual DNA, affecting the choices we make, such as how we treat others, and how we view ourselves and God. By giving our hurts and disappointments to God, the Father of Truth (see John 14:6), we are able to work through the details of the deception effectively, thus allowing God to bind up our broken hearts and set us free from lies (Isaiah 61:1). So let us not be like the crowd that Jesus saw, harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. We have a great and mighty Shepherd. Let us realize it and call on His Name!

This large layer represents what happens if we choose to believe the lie. When we adopt Satan's thought patterns about ourselves in place of God's truth, we enter into a cycle of sinful nature. The pus and infection caused by the lies we believed affects how we view ourselves, how we view God, how we love our husbands, raise our children, and interact with the world. We pour into others from this layer of our heart. (see Matthew 12:34-35)

Satan exploits the wound with his lies about God and our identity. This is the moment where we choose to claim truth or believe the lies from the enemy, thus determining the contents of our hearts. (see John 10:10)

The smallest area represents the real issue/s or original entry point of the wound. This could have taken place in childhood or adulthood and may include hurtful words or actions, or any type of abuse. (see John 16:33)

"I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." (John 16:33 NIV84)

"The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it more abundantly." (John 10:10 NIV84)

"For out of the overflow of the heart the mouth speaks. A good man brings good things out of the good stored up in him, and the hurt man brings hurt things out of the hurt stored up in him." (Matthew 12:34-35 NIV84) [Emphasis added]

The smallest area at the bottom of the heart illustration is the wound. Countless situations cause these wounds in us. Some examples include hurtful words spoken, being bullied, verbal, emotional, physical, spiritual, or sexual abuse, the loss of a parent or family member, or a cherished friend, abandonment by one or both parents, the divorce of your parents, an unfaithful spouse, a porn-addicted spouse, etc. The list goes on and on.

The next area is where Satan makes his attempt with his lies concerning the wound, like, "I am unlovable" or "I am not smart enough" or even, "If I knew how to satisfy my husband, he would not have turned to pornography."

The simple and clear truth is that the enemy hates you and me, and he is always looking for ways to steal our identity in Christ. Satan's main purpose is to get us to sin against God, causing fellowship to break between our Creator and us. As a result, we tend to hear the enemy louder than we do our Heavenly Father, and we begin to move further and further away from the truth, which brings us to the biggest section in the illustration.

The pus and sickness of layer #3 is designed to keep us from seeing the very bottom layer—the truth—instead of the lies concerning the wound. In my view, this is the portion of our spiritual heart from which we function in our day-to-day lives. It affects our ability to love God, how we function in our marriages, how we parent, and how we interact with the world. The wound is the potential entry point for Satan. If we choose not to believe the lie by saying, "No, I am not the reason my dad left the family," then Satan gains no authority in our lives because we have chosen truth over the lie he tried to plant.

However, if we choose to believe the lie, then that wound becomes infected and it continues to fester. The infection continues to spread and taints more and more of our thoughts about ourselves and God. The temptation to believe the thought is not the sin, but when we reject truth and believe the lie, we commit treason against God, giving Satan authority to harass us—by giving in to the sin.

Satan cannot gain authority in our lives unless given authority. Plainly put, when we step into the temptation of Satan and give in to sin, we give Satan authority in our lives. Remember, God tempts no one (James 1:13), but Satan is referred to as "the tempter" in Matthew 4:3.

To walk in freedom, we must allow Jesus to show us the truth, before we can get rid of the anger, hurt, and unforgiveness in our heart. Jesus is the only One

who can truly heal us. It is only then that we can move forward in forgiveness and walk in freedom.

Can you walk cancer-free if you have not been healed of the cancer? No, to be cancer-free, you must be healed of the cancer; it must be taken out of your physical body. Unaddressed hurt and pain work the same way in your spiritual self. It's not just going to go away if left untreated, but will grow and fester, changing how you think and act. It will eventually steal your life, whether it be through depression, never discovering your purpose, not knowing who you were created to be in Christ, and even physical death (1 Corinthians 15:44-49; Romans 12:2, 1 Thessalonians 5:23-24).

DEAR FRIEND, I HOPE ALL IS WELL WITH YOU AND THAT YOU ARE AS HEALTHY IN BODY AS YOU ARE STRONG IN SPIRIT. —3 JOHN 1:2 NLT

Matthew 12:33-35 clearly describes the heart illustration above. This is where we get the term "hurt people, hurt people." If we have unresolved pain, hatred, anger, etc., in our hearts, it is scriptural that it will flow out of our mouths and inflict pain on others. We often don't realize this is the case, which is why we need to ask Jesus to help reveal the infection to us. Though some will have deeper wounds than others, we all have hurts that we need to surrender to God. "If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us" (1 John 1:8 NIV).

However, when we cling to the truth of our Living God, our hearts become full of godly thoughts, the fruit that comes from His Spirit within us. The wound is healed and erased, and as you can see from the illustration below, the hard crust of our hearts softens and breaks up, allowing God's love and good seed to come in and take root in the soft and supple soil of our hearts. God's love radiates from us, as we begin to walk in our destiny as daughters of God, as wives mothers, and disciple-makers. We help advance the kingdom on earth, powerful and effective as the fruit of our lives proves our love and hope in Jesus.

Keeping the hard crust of our hearts broken up, as well as maintaining the quality of soil inside, is a lifelong process, a process you will learn in the next several weeks. We live in a dark and hurtful world, being subjected to new hurt and pain every day. The goal of this book is to allow Jesus to clean out any present infection in your heart and heal the wounds underneath, as well as learn how to identify the real enemy real-time and claim truth so you can maintain a healthy heart as you walk in freedom!

IT'S TIME TO DUST OFF YOUR GLOVES AND GARDENING TOOLS GIRLS. WE HAVE WORK TO DO!

Allowing Jesus to heal you is a necessary step in your spiritual journey for deeper intimacy with Him. Trust His Word and the process laid out for you. As you move through Letting the Healer Heal, take time to look up the verses mentioned. Ask God to help your heart understand His Word and for His help dealing with any unbelief you may have (Mark 9:24).

True transformation takes time, it is encouraged to move at the pace of the group. There is no need to rush through the lessons, just make sure to stay on task. In the lessons ahead, your relationship with Jesus will be elevated to a new level as you learn how to pour out your heart to God through writing Hurt Letters.

Words Exercise

Sometimes we have a cultural view of what common words mean. As we enter into this place of healing and transformation with Jesus, it will be important to have a clear meaning of what certain words mean. Take the word "heart" for instance. There are over 800 references in Scripture about our hearts. It's important to understand what part of us Scripture is referring to when it says to "guard your heart above all else" (Proverbs 4:23-24), and that "your heart will condemn you" (1 John 3:20).

Another example is the prayer for us in Ephesians 3:16-17a; "I pray that out of His glorious riches he may strengthen our inner being so that Christ may dwell in your **hearts** through faith." God isn't referring to the cute little shape we doodle on our papers around the things we love, nor is He referencing the organ in our bodies that keeps our blood moving. Do you see the value in understanding what part of ourselves He is referencing when He is giving us instruction? How can we guard our hearts if we don't understand which part of our make-up He is talking about?

In the space below use your Bible concordance, like the Strong's Concordance or www.BlueLetterBible.org (both are available in apps for smartphones), to get a better understanding of the term "heart" in the verses below. Rewrite the verse in your own words using your findings. Be sure to note any convictions the Holy Spirit gives you during this exercise and be prepared to share with the group.

- **STEP 1**: This exercise can be broken up and used as your Quiet Time for the first week of the lesson. I recommend taking your time through the word study to help you grasp the biblical meaning behind keywords in Scripture. This is vital to moving forward in healing and deeper intimacy with God.
- **STEP 2:** Using your concordance, look up the highlighted words, plus any others you may not fully understand in the verses below.
- **STEP 3:** Rewrite the verse in your own words using your findings from step 1 above for greater understanding.

Remember, the more you put into these exercises the more you will get out of them. God's Word never returns void!

Life Application

Johnny was the oldest of his siblings. He grew up with a dominant mother and absent father. He was always getting interrupted when he spoke. Johnny never felt like he was heard, and he began to believe the lie that what he had to say wasn't important. As an adult, Johnny struggled with feeling insecure about his self-worth and value. He hated to be interrupted!

One night while sitting at the dinner table with his own family, Johnny was telling a story about work when his wife, intrigued, interrupted him with a question about his story. Johnny pressed his lips together and gripped the edges of the dining table with both hands so tightly his knuckles turned white. Awkward silence fell over the table as his wife began to apologize for not waiting until he was finished to ask a question. Johnny told her to forget it and refused to tell the rest of his story, finishing his supper in silence.

In this example, Johnny's wound was never being listened to as a child. He was always spoken over and interrupted. The enemy used this to convince Johnny that his thoughts were of little importance. As he matured, he became bitter in his heart, which caused him to be harsh and unloving towards his family, causing another generation of hurt and frustrated children. Johnny was not a bad man, but as God's Word explains, hurt people, hurt people (see Matthew 12:33-35).

When we have unaddressed wounds, we interpret every word spoken to us through the grid of our pain, often leaving us with the emotional maturity level of the age we were when the wound happened. Frequently, hurt people live trying to fight off depression and frustration as a result of these bad seeds that were planted in their hearts somewhere along the way. Pain comes in various degrees of intensity. You may not have obvious wounds, but due to the increased darkness in our world, it's a good idea to ask God to show you if there is something He would like to heal or correct in you.

When He saw the crowds He had compassion on them, Because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. —Matthew 9:36 NIV

Experiencing God in this intimate way helps Him to become real to us. Sadly, I admit, before I encountered God in my hurt places like this, He was not as personal to me as I thought. I was learning as an adult through hearing sermons and Sunday school lessons about a loving God who did all of these amazing things. However, it wasn't until I started experiencing healing in my own heart that Jesus became someone I truly relied on in hard times.

As much as I wanted to believe He was the same today as He was in biblical times, it took experiencing His healing presence in the pain of my own life for my heart to fully believe He could love me enough to die for me. I was able to trust Him on deeper levels with less effort on my part because I had experienced His grace and love first hand. My ability to **not be afraid and just believe** (see Mark 5:36), that every word of God is flawless—and He wants good things for me, like a whole heart and freedom from the lies that once held me captive—increased after I allowed Jesus into my hurt places. I realized I didn't want a relationship with God I could live with, I wanted one I could not live without!

When I saw Jesus walk into the middle of my pain, His goodness became undeniable to my heart. Being set free from lies about myself and God gave me a more accurate view of love. I was better able to see others the way Jesus sees them—which was not as evil, but as broken and hurting.



- To understand why Jesus cared so much about binding up the brokenhearted and setting captives free, we must be able to grasp the effects of unaddressed pain and woundedness, how bitterness sets in, and what to do about it.
- 2. True transformation takes time and there is no need to rush through the lessons, just make sure to stay on task.
- 3. Remember to pray for your group mates as well as yourself! You are all headed into enemy territory that must be seized and given back to its rightful Owner, with a capital "O." Do not be unaware of the enemy's schemes and stay in the LIGHT!
- 4. Take time to look up every verse mentioned and ask God to help your heart understand, and to help with any unbelief you may have.

Faith in the Healer

KEY POINT

Knowing God's character is vital for your spiritual healing and growth. Trusting someone with our deepest secrets and pain requires a deeper relationship. This lesson focuses on the characteristics and loving nature of God.

WHY THIS MATTERS

Knowing our Father's character is key to growing in unwavering faith and trust that He is good and the promises of His Word are meant for you.

HOW TO APPLY

Spend time meditating on the passages of Scripture provided in this lesson. As you move through the lessons to follow, come back and revisit the Scriptures on pages 33-34 for remembrance of God's goodness, love, and mercy.

The Purge

KEY POINT

Knowing God's character is vital for your spiritual healing and Sharing the unsavory things we try to hide in our hearts with God is not only an act of courage and faith—but obedience. God wants to know us intimately. He tells us to pour out our hearts to Him throughout Scripture. As we learn to trust Him with our deep pain and disappointments, we begin to depend on Him in greater ways, turning to Him first for our security, worth, and value. To walk in freedom, you must first be healed from the wound.

WHY THIS MATTERS

This is important because before we can walk in to our God-given design, we must purge the junk from our hearts that wasn't designed to be there. Jesus wants to know us. He wants us to know Him so well, that we don't hesitate before we run to Him with our pain and failures.

HOW TO APPLY

We learn to open up the places in our hearts that we have tried to hide from Jesus by asking Him where He wants to start. Then we write Jesus a detailed "Hurt Letter" about the instance that He brought to our mind.

Flip It

KEY POINT

Becoming a woman of the Word helps us know God's character. The more we learn how Jesus treated those around Him, the easier it is for us to recognize His voice when He speaks to us.

WHY THIS MATTERS

The Word is only Truth—no lie can stand within it. If we know the Word, we will be armed with the Sword of Truth and be better prepared for battle! Learning to identify the difference between the Truth God speaks to us, and the lies of the enemy, is the beginning of your journey to true and lasting freedom in Jesus Christ.

HOW TO APPLY

You apply this skill by asking God to help you identify the lies in your Hurt Letter, flip the lie for Truth, then anchor that Truth with Scripture.

Repentance and Forgiveness

KEY POINT

Learn how to move into true repentance with God, which is critical for greater intimacy with Him. As your heart becomes pure before the Lord, you will draw closer to Him.

WHY THIS MATTERS

As you grow deeper in your relationship with your Heavenly Father, you begin to trust His goodness on deeper levels. Understanding that God truly is merciful and does not desire to punish you, but desires to help you move into true and pure repentance, helps you receive His forgiveness and extend that same forgiveness to others.

HOW TO APPLY

As you work your way through this lesson, you will learn of God's immeasurable love and compassion for you as His child. You will see how He moves in your life with great acts of kindness leading you into right standing with Him.

Forgiving Self

KEY POINT

Grasp the truth that Jesus died on the Cross for you. He has forgiven you! It's time for you to surrender your disappointments of who you were not designed to be and walk into your God-given identity.

WHY THIS MATTERS

The only way to lasting freedom is through Jesus Christ.

HOW TO APPLY

Learn to see yourself the way Jesus sees you.

Love Letters

KEY POINT

Learn how to start hearing God's love for you over the lies of the enemy.

WHY THIS MATTERS

Walking in God's love is a vital key to walking into your God-given design.

HOW TO APPLY

Now that you are building a strong foundation of God's truth with a pure heart, you can begin to choose truth and reject lies, because you know your worth is in Jesus Christ!

The Power of Choice

KEY POINT

You choose what you value!

WHY THIS MATTERS

Understand you always have a choice with God. Freedom is never an option with the enemy.

HOW TO APPLY

Learn how to make the heart-illustration applicable in real time, avoiding bitterness setting in and hardening your heart.

Your Living Testimony

KEY POINT

Movements of God fly on the wings of testimonies—and your testimony is the life you live as a child of God in front of a lost and hurting world.

WHY THIS MATTERS

The story of your redemption through Jesus Christ is just a story if you don't live in a way that proves your faith. Living out your testimony in front of others will open doors for you to share your journey with God and bring hope to the lost and hurting.

HOW TO APPLY

The more vulnerable you are with others—the more readily they will see Jesus in you. The fruit of your faith will speak for itself.
